

Lymph Node Biopsy

What Is A Lymph Node Biopsy?

A lymph node biopsy is a simple procedure where a small piece of tissue is taken from one of your lymph nodes for testing. Lymph nodes are small, bean-shaped structures that form part of your immune system and help fight infections. When one or more lymph nodes become swollen or feel abnormal, a biopsy can help determine the cause. This procedure is used to check for conditions such as infections, inflammation or cancer.

Why Might You Need A Lymph Node Biopsy?

You may need a lymph node biopsy if your doctor has noticed that one or more of your lymph nodes are enlarged or have an unusual texture. This could be due to a variety of reasons, including infections or other conditions that affect your immune system. In some cases, it is done to investigate possible signs of cancer. A lymph node biopsy can provide important information that helps your healthcare team decide on the best course of treatment for you.

Common reasons for a lymph node biopsy include:

- Unexplained swelling of lymph nodes
- Persistent tenderness in one or more lymph nodes
- Signs that suggest an infection or inflammation
- Suspicion of cancer based on other tests or physical findings

What To Expect At Your Consultation

Before your lymph node biopsy, you will have a consultation with your ENT specialist who will explain the procedure in simple terms and answer any questions you might have. On the day of your biopsy, you will be made as comfortable as possible.



What To Expect During The Procedure

- Local anaesthetic to numb the area around the lymph node
- A small incision or needle insertion to remove a tiny sample of tissue
- The procedure typically taking only a short time, often less than an hour
- Minimal discomfort during and after the biopsy
- A quick recovery that allows you to return home the same day

Your doctor may choose a different technique depending on the location and size of the lymph node, but the goal is always to safely obtain enough tissue for an accurate diagnosis.

Aftercare And Recovery

After the lymph node biopsy, it is important to follow your aftercare instructions to help your body heal and reduce the risk of any complications. You may experience some tenderness or slight swelling at the biopsy site, which is normal. Your ENT specialist will provide detailed guidance on how to care for the area and what activities to avoid for a short time.

You may be advised to:

- Keep the biopsy site clean and dry
- Avoid strenuous activities for a couple of days
- Take any prescribed pain relief if you experience discomfort
- Monitor the area for signs of infection such as increased redness or discharge
- Attend any scheduled follow-up appointments so your progress can be monitored

Most people recover quickly from a lymph node biopsy and can resume their normal activities soon after the procedure.
